Essex Schools Championships Chelmsford Saturday 11th June 2022

Havering's youngsters came home with 29 medals, nine of the gold, from Saturday's Essex Schools Championships at a blustery Chelmsford.

The sprinters and hurdlers produced the richest crop with 11 podium places. Stephanie Okoro won the Intermediate Girls' 300m hurdles title in style, setting a new championship best with the fastest time in the UK this year. Zara Okocha won the Inter 100m by the slimmest of margins in a photo finish, but Cassie Campbell was edged out of Inter 200m gold and Miriam Adebayo won Inter 300m silver. Fisola Fagbadegun and Mya Thomas won silver and bronze in the Junior 100m, as Amy Mansell won Junior 300m bronze. Paris King shrugged off injury to earn Inter 80m hurdles silver, as Ruby Tillson won bronze, and Al-Ameen Salaam won silver in the Inter 100m hurdles, as did Daniel Lammas in the Inter 400m.

The quality of the club's throwers shone through with nine medals, eight of them gold or silver, as Bobby Williams and Matthew Page won Inter javelin gold and silver, as did Lucy Quinlan and Emily Fessey Cook in the Inter girls equivalent. Katie Ennis and Erin Delea won gold and silver in the Inter discus, as there were junior golds for Zak Williams in the javelin and Zoe McLean-Tattan in the discus and Zikora Ezeonwuka completed the medal roll with inter shot bronze.

Freddie Rowe won the Junior 1500m with the fifth fastest time by a club Under 15, as Findlay McLaren won bronze. Charlotte Evans and Abi Swan won silver and bronze in the Inter Girls 1500m, there were more medals for the Inters as Owen Fisher and Charlie Burgess won silver and bronze in the steeplechase, and Sam Mahoney won 800m bronze.

Sophia Willson's high jump PB won her silver in the junior girls' competition and Eliza Poulson also set a new personal mark for bronze in the Inter Triple jump.
