Havering's young athletes made it two wins out of two at their Youth Development League, Southern Division 1 season with another victory at Sutcliffe Park, Eltham on Sunday, winning all four age categories.

The **Under 16 Boys** were comfortable winners due to their overall strength in depth. Joshua Buxton won the sprint hurdles in a PB and equalled his 100m sprint PB in second. Derin Okubanjo won both the B string sprint and high jump events. Jake Tregidgo's PB won the 800m B, while Jack Rossington was A string runner up and another B string win came from Henry Langford in the 300m hurdles with Nathan Hathaway second in the A event in a PB. There was a glut of second places as Ameer Salaam suffered his first defeat of the season in the shot in second, Tobi Oluborode Oluseye was second in both the B 300m and A long jump as Oba Samuel returned from illness for second in the long jump B string. David Ojo Ekhaton was B 100m runner up and the javelin pairing of Reuben McDermott and Barney Sullivan were second in both javelin A & B strings.

The **Under 14 Boys** notched up 10 victories, with Elijah Lowe winning both sprints and the B shot and William Hiles winning the A shot and B 200m. Gideon Lee won both the A long jump and javelin on his league debut, Rajveer Nahr won the B hurdles and Dre Overare the B 100m. There were second places for Adeleke Adenuga (high jump) and Tomiwa Okubanjo (B long jump). Dre, William, Gideon and Elijah combined to win the sprint relay in the fastest time in Britain so far this season.

Millie Cook was the only A string winner in the 300m, and she was 800m A runner up in a strong all round showing for the **Under 16 Girls** team. Ome Nwapa won the B sprint hurdles and was second in the long jump, Siobhan Etemadi was second in the A string sprint hurdles, with both girls setting new hurdles PBs while Esther Olajide won the B high jump. Abigail Adegite was second in both the 300m hurdles and B 800m, and Amelie Shearing was second in the 300m hurdles B. Ayla Baker was second in both the javelin and shot, with Danielle Adeyinka second in the B shot. Second places were earned by Kiera Senior (100m B), Scarlett Barclay (300m B) and Mia Borisova (B Long jump). The 4x300m relay team of Abigail, Esther, Scarlett and Millie were victorious and the sprint relay quartet of Siobhan, Keira, Danielle and Ome were second.

There were nine wins for the **Under 14 Girls**, with Olivia Rae Vaughan winning the long jump and B 200m, Ava McMillan the B the 100m and long jump, and both girls adding second places in the 100m (Olivia) and 200m (Ava). The hurdles pairing of Lucy Tregidgo and Edie Smith both won, as did high jumpers Isla Herrera and Elsie Smith with Sophia Karim (javelin) completing the victory roll. There were runners up points for Betsy Morrow and Destiny Carbon (A & B shot), and Violet Everett (1500m B). Betsy, Ava, Destiny and Olivia were the sprint relay runners up.
