



London Indoor Games – Age Groups Lee Valley Sat 27th & Sun 28th January

There were some fine results at the well-attended London Indoor Games for young athletes, with almost 800 athletes signed up for the two-day event at Lee Valley at the weekend.

South of England indoor champion Joel Ajayi was again the fastest Under 17 sprinter on show as he came within 1-100th of a second of his recent club 60m record with his 6.85s clocking. His training partner Tobias Samuel improved his best to 7.33s to win his heat and also set a new long jump mark with his 6.01m jump in fourth place. Maxwell Adeosun improved his 60m best and returned to place second in the triple jump with his promising 11.94m leap, while Emmanuel Asirifi-Otchere also ran well in his 400m debut.

Amy Mansell's strong finish brought her victory and an indoor PB in the 300m, after smashing her shot best with all four of her throws above her previous mark, to place third. Maggie Smith won her long jump pool with an indoor best and twice improved her 60m hurdles season's best. Fisola Fagbadegun and Mary Olubukola-Sogbetun opened their accounts in the Under 17 age group in the 200m.

In the Under 15 age group Jess Page won her 800m heat and Lila Chapelhow was just short of her indoor shot putt best in her first competition since joining Havering.
